June Mission Emphasis -Project Fresh Start

For the past sixteen school years, Ankeny's Project Fresh Start has distributed school supplies and backpacks to public school students in need in our district. PFC plans to distribute supplies in early August prior to the start of the 21-22 school year. Last year, 800 backpacks were distributed during the scheduled time and an additional 200 were distributed during the school year to students who have relocated, transferred or have found themselves in need of assistance.

Ankeny Christian Church has supported this worthwhile project numerous times. Considering the turmoil of the past year, it is anticipated that there will be an even greater need for many families.

Rather than purchasing individual supplies to donate, financial donations are suggested and PFC will be able to purchase items through participating suppliers at a reduced cost. Dave Kissinger, founder of PFS, is available to provide additional information if necessary.

Hello, Church!

As you are all aware, Pastor Owen is currently on his three-month sabbatical. We had a lovely service sending him off with our blessing and our love as he embarks on rest, play, and renewal.

Rev. Josh Patty, our Regional Minister, gave a beautiful message about how we are all together in the same Spirit. Just as Owen is renewing his spirit, so are we to find some space to rest and renew as well. It was a good, good service and a wonderful way to begin our sabbath time together, even though physically apart.

At the Christian Conference Center this summer for camp, our curriculum is entitled "This is Our Prayer". The campers will spend each day learning not only different ways to pray, but the ways that prayer holds us throughout our traditions and stories. I direct one of the High School camps, and it is customary that each director takes one day and tailors the curriculum to the age group and to their camp. The day I chose was "Sabbath". I had a marvelous time putting the curriculum together (I really always do!), and I went over what I had written for 2020 before all of our plans were changed. I noticed how a lot of what I had written previously had the campers exploring the benefit of slowing down - of resting - of putting activities and other things down for a moment.

And I wondered, How is sabbath different now? I wondered, How are we supposed to talk about sabbath after a season where so many of us were forced to put things down, sometimes begrudgingly, and while grieving?

I am not sure if you all are feeling this way, but I'm beginning to feel a sense of opening up as our world begins to shift to a new way forward. I feel like I am moving at a quicker pace and there's more structure to my day and I LOVE it! I love having a full to-do list and a full schedule of meetings (in- person)! But I am also finding that while I missed this way that my schedule used to be, I do not want to go back to "normal" or whatever that might have been! I don't want to get swept up in all of the things that I could do after a season of not having much

to do. | am more choosy with my activities and how | spend my time.

If I have learned anything, I have learned the importance of slowing down, of taking time to be with my beloveds, and of doing the activities that fill me and bring me closer to God. This is the lesson I've learned on sabbath in the past year. What about you?

My hope for each of us as we journey along this sabbatical season, even as the world begins spinning as it used to, that we can take time to breath, to find space, to relax and renew, to refresh, and to find peace.

May it be so! Amen.
