Christmas Service on Zoom

The past few years Pastors Alison and Owen have hosted a Blue Christmas service at the church. While many meet this time of year with joy and excitement, the cries of "Merry Christmas" contrast with the feelings of some at this time of year.

For those suffering from the recent or impending death of loved ones, dealing with recent separation or divorce, struggling to find employment, or facing depression or family crisis, sadness surrounding lives lost to COVID, or even just the pressures that often come with the season, this can be a very isolated and dreary time. We recognize that a lot of Christmas celebrations do not meet everyone's needs.

This service will honor where on the feeling spectrum people find themselves. We will make space for healing

and hope and together we will bear each others' burdens. We will be, with them, light in the darkness. The difference this year is that it will be on Zoom on Monday, December 21 at 7 p.m. Watch the weekly news for the link!

However, at 8:30 p.m. that night we will also gather in the parking lot at ACC to hear the Christmas story from Luke, light our candles, and sing "Silent Night" together.

More instructions will follow as to how to participate that evening as we gather safely to tell and live the story!

Pastor Owen's Note

While growing up one of my favorite traditions for getting ready for Christmas was our Advent Calendar. It was this large, golden-yellow felt banner with 24 pockets and there was a green Christmas tree in the center with 24 golden buttons on it.

I even remember the year that my mom made it, though I couldn't tell you exactly what year that was. What I remember is that I thought it odd that mom was painting wooden Christmas ornaments in the summer. When I asked her about it, she would respond dismissively, something about "you'll see", or "well, doing it at Christmas would be a little late, wouldn't it?"

Each day in December, my sister Sonya and I would be up eagerly ready to reach into the pocket for the day – numbered 24-1 to count down the days until Christmas. It was a real treat on the days it was my turn, because I got to read the activity for the day and place the ornament on the tree (though we couldn't put it on top of the tree, that space was reserved for the angel ornament that we knew after a couple years of practice was in the last one – Christmas Eve when the angel would announce the birth of Jesus). Each day brought a verse of

scripture and some activity that we would do that day to prepare our house for Christmas: one day it was read the Christmas story from the Bible, one day was putting up the tree, one day was setting up the manger scene, one day was making cookies, and so on.

In our house, on that calendar, and even in our eagerness, there was a growing sense that something was coming. There was something for which we were preparing. The excitement and anticipation were palpable.

This Sunday, November 29, we will be doing a Hanging of the Greens service. Of course, because of our limitations this year, it will be quite a bit different. Since it is a virtual decorating, it won't be happening with the decorations in the sanctuary. Rather, people will be sharing their favorite decorations.

There are going to be lots of things different this year, which makes our home connections to the story all the more important. Most of these decorations have significance within the story that we as followers of Jesus tell this time of year, from the greens we use for the wreaths, to the lights on houses and in windows, to the Christmas tree, to Santa Clause, to, of course, the nativities that many of us have at home. Many of our home decorations and traditions connect with us on personal levels. There is a real sense in which our traditions intersect with the traditions of the church, and our stories intersect with God's story.

The fact that things are different this year doesn't mean that we can't continue to connect with the stories of prophets and Mary, of John the Baptist and Joseph, of shepherds and Magi, and of baby Jesus, who brings light to the world, song to the angels, and peace to all the earth. We still believe, even when things are...well, discombobulated!

So, I encourage you: keep as many traditions as you can, but also be ready to tell the story in new ways. I know that at our house we plan to pick back up some traditions we have let slide as our two oldest boys have gotten older. Together we will wait, eagerly anticipate, and tell the story of Jesus!

Ankeny Christian Church Covid-19 update November 20, 2020

The Covid-19 committee continues to meet on a weekly basis. Our purpose is to make recommendations to the Church Executive Council on pandemic related matters specifically impacting the church. The Church Executive Council ultimately makes the decision on next steps.

The committee made a recommendation to Executive Council on November 5 to discontinue in-building worship beginning on November 8 and subsequent Sunday's. This decision was not an easy action to take; however, we believe that it was the best course of action given the disproportionate spike in Covid-19 cases throughout Ankeny, Polk county, the State of Iowa and the United States.

The committee made their decision based on a number of metrics which we followed closely.

As we continue to consider future in-building worship activities, we will look to these and other resources.

- Polk County overall positivity rate shall be 15% or less and stable or decreasing over a two-week period.
- Zip code data for 50021, 50023, 50026, 50073 shall be stable or decreasing over a two-week period.
- Metro hospitalizations shall be steady and or decreasing for

a two-week period.

- Metro ICU admissions shall be steady or decreasing for a two-week period.
- CDC, Polk County and Iowa Department of Public Health Guidance shall be reviewed regarding public assembly and safety.
- Ankeny Community Schools data shall be reviewed and evaluated.

We anticipate that once our guidelines are met, it will take approximately 10 days to initiate in-building services.

We will continue to utilize our worship covenant as a foundation for any and all contacts at ACC.

Highlights of the covenant:

- Wearing a face mask as a symbol of love and care for others
- Honor and respect the sacredness of each person and stay home if I am feeling unwell, have knowingly been exposed to the virus, or if I have been traveling, knowing that God is present with us wherever we go whether inside or outside of the church building
- Work together to follow proper sanitary guidelines as outlined by the CDC and our COVID Task Force to create and maintain a safe and healthy place for us to worship
- Follow the direction of our volunteers to find a place to sit in worship, and greet others in ways that are safe and physically distant, knowing that God works in the in-between spaces
- Have grace for others and their comfort level in regard to what they participate in, as we're all in this together for the first time!

We will continue to have on-line Sunday worship!
