September Mission “Food Bowl”

While the universities are debating how best to position their sports programs through league affiliations, we at ACC know that supporting the DMARC Food Pantry through financial donations is also an extremely vital decision. Endowment

What is Endowment at Ankeny Christian Church? It’s a chance to give to the future of the church. Funds are deposited in the Christian Church Foundation, a secure investment that only works with Disciples of Christ churches. The money is never withdrawn, however the earnings from these investments can be used to make a difference in programing or missions, year after year after year.

Several of us have established in our wills to leave a portion to the Endowment Fund at ACC. We will be part of a legacy that continues to give long after we’re gone. Some folks have left the Endowment Funds as a beneficiary on their insurance policies. Some people have designated memorial funds to be left to the Endowment Fund to honor their loved ones and have them live on in the life of the church.

Donations can be made at any time in stage of life. Gladys and Jerry Sawyer deposited funds years ago. They use the annual earnings to donate to the Week of Compassion. The earnings in the ACC Endowment Fund currently amount to over \$1500/year. Those

funds are divided by four committees to use at their discretion in addition to their budgeted funds, allowing for opportunities that otherwise wouldn't be possible. Thanks to the people who had the foresight and generosity to give to our Endowment Fund. There is no minimum amount to give; together we can build a future of Positive People Doing God's Work for future generations.

Silent Auction Will Happen!!

Tentative, possible, maybe, plans are that there will be the traditional Silent Auction this November. No specific details are available, but a heads up to get creative and be ready to show off your talents. If you are short on talents, show your support by donating something of value that might become someone's treasure. Everyone is welcome to participate by bidding on and purchasing the donated items. The income generated from this event is crucial as it allows ACC to give financial gifts to members of our congregation to enable them to secure a special Christmas Holiday. 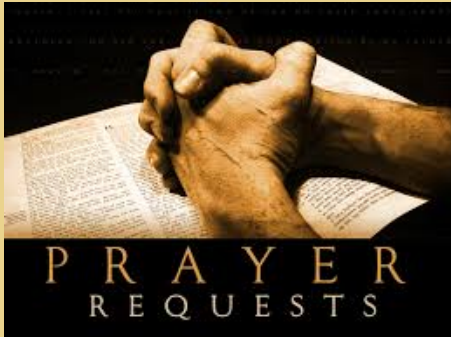
